He shall judge between the nations and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation; neither shall they learn war any more. — Isaiah 2:4

July is an interesting time, as American Christians, to be thinking about peace. This weekend, we will gather to watch fireworks explode in the sky in celebration of the Revolutionary War fought by our forebears nearly 250 years ago. As I am writing this, our nation is engaged in violent military action against Iran. By the time you are reading this, I do not know what the status of that will be, and whether war will have been declared, or if parties will agree to a ceasefire, or something else entirely.

Maybe you opened this newsletter after seeing news of unending conflict, hoping to not think about that for a minute. But I have had conversations with several of you in recent weeks about your concerns about war and violence, and so I think it is worth addressing.

I turned 37 on June 30, and in my lifetime, the United States has been engaged in several armed conflicts around the world. Those of you who are older than I am have even more memories of war and of the losses associated with it. You and your loved ones have served in the armed forces; one of my beloved chosen family members is currently deployed. There are real human costs to war and conflict, both within our militaries and among the millions of civilians who live in harm's way.

Our scripture presents a confusing picture, at times, about war. There are many battles depicted between the people of God and their enemies, and yet Jesus calls on us to love our enemies (Luke 6:27). Many wars have been fought in the name of Christ, and yet Jesus says "blessed are the peacemakers" (Matthew 5:9).

The prophet Isaiah, quite famously, insists that God calls us to lay down our weapons of war—not only that, but to turn our weapons into tools we can use for agriculture. That the opposite of war is not only peace but creation. That instead of destruction, we can cultivate new life.

As you try to process the ever-changing landscape of war in our world, I encourage you to consider what actions we can take that bring about its opposite. Start by praying for an end to war and violence, and for the presence of peace around the world. Pray for all the different kinds of peacemakers in our midst—yourself included. What can you create in a world that already has more than enough destruction to go around?

Can you plant something? If you're already an avid gardener or houseplant tender, spend some extra time taking care of those living things. What about art? Even if you are not an artist (like me), can you get out some arts and crafts materials and just joyfully make something imperfect? Make a card and mail it to a faraway loved one. If there's a musical instrument gathering dust in your closet, can you laugh at yourself in an attempt to make a joyful (though not necessarily beautiful) noise to the Lord? Your singing voice (in whatever shape it may be) can also serve this purpose. Write a poem. Learn a dance step. Bake a pie. Send some love out into the world.

When you feel helpless, one of the best remedies is to help someone else. Do you have a neighbor you can share a meal with or whose lawn needs mowing? Have you been meaning to volunteer at the food pantry or to serve a meal at the Turk Center? Is there another ministry here at SMLC that is calling your name? Together, we can create a community that is resilient and that prioritizes hope and joy over fear.

Council Update

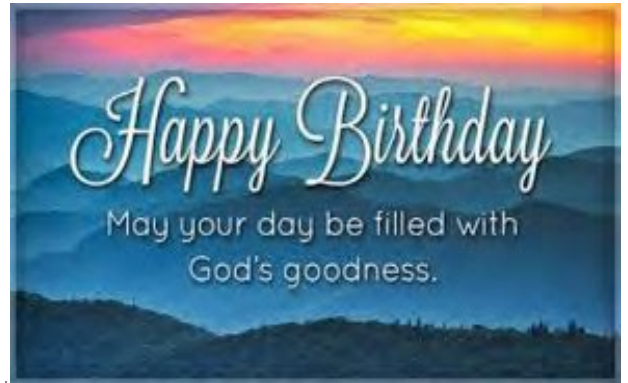
Hello SMLC! Here are the updates for the June Council meeting.

The Council met on June 18 for our regular monthly meeting. The Council accepted and/or approved the submitted minutes and reports. The Council considered 2 items of business: 1) the Council approved the section from the Ministry Events Policy that described the use of the parking lots for Ministry events and the alcohol, tobacco and substance use policy for an event, and 2) the Council discussed the ongoing work to replace the supplemental HVAC system on the office and sanctuary building.

Lastly, the Council discussed and drafted the policy for the involvement of committees and volunteers. The Council also discussed the policy for providing food at Ministry events. These policies will be considered for approval at the August council meeting and will provide additional guidance to Pastor Casey, the SMLC staff, and event volunteers as we continue to plan these events, such as the 4th of July parking lot celebration. Since the Ministry Event has been discussed by the Council for the past few months, many of the important policies to guide organizers are now available for use. If you would like to organize a ministry event, particularly those that have been discussed by the Council, please contact Pastor Casey to plan.

The Council will not be meeting in July as we prepare for the busy time for the Council in the fall. Thank you for the opportunity to serve as president for 2025 and for your continued support of SMLC, our Council, Pastor Casey, and the staff.
