It has been such a delight to be gathered with all of you for our Summer Single Service these past few weeks! I hope you have enjoyed connecting or reconnecting with other SMLC-goers that you don't see as frequently, during the service as well as at Community Time afterward. If you have not stuck around for Community Time, I encourage you to give it a try in July. We'll learn more about earthkeeping, hear from the Social Action Committee, and more!

In addition to the Sunday morning opportunity for fellowship, a handful of us gathered for the first of my monthly Outdoor Office Hours, this time at Ascend Coffee Roasters with chai lattes and chit-chat. (In July, Outdoor Office Hours are at Rip Current Brewing—details about that are elsewhere in this newsletter.) It is good for us to be together, any day of the week.

As I continue to make plans for our life together this summer, I do so with the intention of slowness and rest. In your household, it may be that summer has the same level of activity as any other time of year, or perhaps even ramps up as you figure out where kids or grandkids can spend their unscheduled daytime hours. In whatever situation you find yourself, I invite you to carve out time for restful practices that you enjoy. Now that the sun is (finally) reliably shining, I hope you are slathering on your sunscreen and getting outside a bit.

For me, as you might guess, the indoor/outdoor restful practice of my choice is reading. When I came to SMLC for a "meet and greet" before you voted to call me as your next pastor, one of the questions someone asked was about the best book I'd read recently. I answered that I'd been surprised to love a science-fiction series called The Wayfarers by Becky Chambers. I had not previously considered myself a sci-fi fan, but it turns out that, in any genre, I love a good story. Becky Chambers has written a few other books, some of which I have read, the most relevant to this letter being *A Psalm for the Wild-Built*, the first in her Monk & Robot series.

A Psalm for the Wild-Built tells the story of a restless monk who sets out on a journey to the wilderness and encounters a curious robot (you can see where the series gets its name). This robot happens to be the first one to make contact with a human since the two races went their separate ways several generations before. As the two encounter one another as (somewhat accidental) representatives of their entire communities, they learn as much about themselves as they do about each other.

In the month of July, I hope you will access a copy of A Psalm for the Wild-Built, read it, and talk with me (and each other) about what it stirs up in you during Community Time on Sunday, July 23. The book is quite short (~150 pages or a 4-hour audiobook) and approachably readable. It is readily available through the San Diego County Library system, as well as via your bookstore of choice. If you do not find a copy or the time to read it, I hope you will join the conversation anyway, and wonder aloud with us about things like hope, vocation, identity, relationships, our environment, technology, faith, and all the ways those complex things intersect.



Interfaith Community Services


