THE GOOD NEWS

Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received.

— 1 Peter 4:10

Each Sunday morning, I greet you by saying "welcome to worship on this [umpteenth] Sunday of Ordinary Time." Have you noticed? Sometimes I say "after Pentecost" instead, just to keep it exciting. We are in the home stretch of the part of the Church year that is empty of holidays, feasts, festivals, and banner-color-changes.

As we enter October, though, things are starting to kick into gear. We're celebrating the Feast of St. Francis on 10/1 with prayers for our earth and a Blessing of the Animals; we'll close out the month by celebrating Martin Luther's contributions to the Protestant Reformation with Reformation Sunday on 10/29. Once we hit November and December, it's full speed ahead on holidays! But we won't get ahead of ourselves. There's still plenty of Ordinary Time to go.

All month, we'll hear Moments for Mission from your neighbors in the pews as we enter into a season of stewardship. God has given us so many good gifts in this community, and we will spend this season celebrating them. Our theme for this year's stewardship campaign is Counting on Community. When have you counted on the SMLC community? When has this community counted on you? How did those encounters—ordinary or extraordinary—make you feel? I invite you to wonder about that.

San Marcos Lutheran Church is many things, but it is first and foremost a congregation, people gathered to praise God and to live out the Gospel in love and compassion and service of one another. We are a community who prays for one another and for those we love; we are a community who laughs together and grieves together; we are a community who supports one another with a ride to worship or a listening ear; we are a community who learns new things together; we are a community who reaches inward to extend a hand out to our neighbors in need.

As you reflect on the days, weeks, months, years, or even decades you have been connected to San Marcos Lutheran Church, you may find it easiest to remember the Big Deals—major milestones and shiny, one-time events. The everyday life of this congregation—our time spent in fellowship and care—may seem fairly ordinary. But it is this ordinariness that holds us all together. The day-in and day-out work of the church requires ordinary things like staff and utilities, paper clips and WiFi access points, communion cups and coffee beans. All of these things go into our annual budget; being good stewards of the gifts God has given us requires a faithful accounting of those gifts.

You will receive a Commitment Card for 2024 (either at worship or in the mail) alongside the opportunity to discern your ability to participate in God's work through this congregation. Prayerfully consider your own financial realities, and what good gifts you have to offer this community. In addition to your generosity of monetary donations, examine your interest and ability to serve this community with your time and talents. As our scripture tells us in no uncertain terms, we are each uniquely gifted by the God who created us and loves us, made to be individual members of the Body of Christ. Your contributions to this community, ordinary and extraordinary, are necessary for the work of the Gospel.



Hello SMLC!

Here are the updates for the September Council meeting:

The Council met on September 19 for our regular monthly meeting. September is the kick-off for the fall season for the church and for the council as we start to plan for 2024 and the needs of the church. The Council had 3 items of business to complete this month. First, the Council appointed 5 persons and Pastor Casey to the Nominating Committee: Anne Voth (Church Secretary), Karen Johns (council member), Diana Arney, Sharon Phelps, and Dana Hogan. If you have interest in serving on Council please contact Anne or Pastor Casey. Second, the Council appointed persons to the Budget Committee: Kelly Van Jen (Church Treasurer), Rob O'Carroll, Victoria Shoup, Dan Norris (Church President), and Pastor Casey. We are still in need of 1 additional person to serve on the Budget Committee. If you have interest, please contact me, Kelly Van Jen, or Pastor Casey. Thirdly, the Council officially set October 8, 2023 at approximately noon (immediately after the 11 o'clock service) for the Special Congregational Meeting to vote on the constitution and bylaws updates. Please plan on attending as we need to have a quorum to conduct this very important business.

Lastly, although there was no decision to be made, the council discussed the Stewardship Campaign which will begin in October to help establish how all the great gifts of our congregation can be used in 2024 to complete our mission to do God's work in our world. Jill Adachi and Doris Payne led that effort. Marilyn Pulver was in charge of the group that assembled over 100 Blessing Bags. Reminder that you can pick these up from the little wagon and have them available in your car to distribute to the homeless. And then there was the potluck luncheon, set up by Jan Parthemer and helpers! So many tasty choices! No one should have left hungry – in body or spirit. Thanks to all who participated. Be thinking of other projects we might tackle next year.






